

## **Voice and valency alternations in Kadorih**

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Kadorih is a dialect of Ot Danum (West Barito, Austronesian), spoken in the upper reaches of Kahayan River, especially in the west of Tumbang Miri. In this paper, I will examine Kadorih voice morphology based on the text frequency, and conclude that: (i) N- is the most frequently used actor voice prefix which takes an Actor subject, (ii) -Vn- is the undergoer voice infix which takes an Undergoer subject, (iii) voice selection is not sensitive to Referential Distance of arguments in narratives, (iv) but is moderately sensitive to definiteness of arguments (N- is preferred if the Undergoer argument is indefinite). Subsequently, I will argue that other verbal affixes have a significant impact on valency, providing evidence based on their frequencies and functions.
